RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Pumpkin Fluff Dip

INGREDIENTS

- 1 (5 ounce) package instant vanilla pudding mix
- 1 (15 ounce) can solid pack pumpkin
- 1 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice
- 1 (16 ounce) container frozen whipped topping, thawed


