#### MARCH SESSION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS of MARCH 13, 2023

- There will be a memorial service for Duncan Caldwell on Saturday, April 1, 2023 at 1:00 pm.
- There will be a Maundy Thursday Service on April 6, 2023 at 7 pm.
- There will be a Good Friday Service on April 7, 2023 at 7 pm.
- Daisey Roe's Flea Markets will be held on Saturday May 20, 2023 and Saturday September 9, 2023.
- An annual meeting of Deacons and Elders will take place after an Interim Pastor has been found.
- The congregation will be kept up-to-date on the Interim Pastor search on a monthly basis.

## RECIPE OF THE MONTH

## **Four-Layer Chocolate Dessert**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 cup all-purpose four
- 1/2 cup cold butter
- 1 cup chopped walnuts
- 8 ounces cream cheese (softened)
- 1 cup confectioners' sugar
- 1 carton of frozen whipped topping, divided 8 oz each (thawed)
- 2 1/2 cups 2% milk
- 2 packages of instant pudding mix
- 1 cup semisweet chocolate chunks
- Chocolate syrup



#### **PREPARATION**

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°. Place flour in a small bowl; cut in butter until crumbly. Stir in 1/2 cup walnuts. Press onto bottom of an ungreased 13x9-in. baking dish. Bake until light golden brown, 12-15 minutes. Cool completely on a wire rack.
- 2. In a small bowl, beat cream cheese and confectioners' sugar until smooth; fold in 1 carton whipped topping. Spread over crust. In a large bowl, whisk milk and pudding mix for 2 minutes. Gently spread over cream cheese layer. Top with remaining whipped topping. Sprinkle with chocolate chunks and remaining walnuts. Refrigerate until cold.
- 3. Cut into bars. Just before serving, drizzle with chocolate syrup
