News from the Pulpit and the Pew

By now we hope you have heard the news that we have met with the Session and will begin serving as your Interim Co-Pastors on December 1, 2023! We will be sharing one position as two part-time pastors. (If you are thinking: BOGO! that's not really the case. Each of us is limited to working less than 20 hrs per week.)

This is the first time we have co-pastored since we left the church in Stillwater in 1993 to start a new church in Fargo, ND, and we are looking forward to working together and sharing ministry with all of you.

Since Jeff and Kay retired last Spring the Presbytery has been searching for an interim pastor without success. Nancy agreed to be your weekly pulpit supply for worship leadership and to moderate the Session. She thought it would be a 2 month assignment!

Meanwhile, David has been enjoying the "view from the pew" and both of us have gotten to know you and appreciate the strength and vitality of this congregation.

One day, it occurred to us: "Here we are – two trained interim pastors, living a stone's throw from the church, watching and waiting for an interim pastor to come to Branchville. Maybe we are the interim pastor(s) God is asking to help lead Branchville to the next phase of its ministry?"

And so the conversation unfolded and has led us to where we are today.

The only thing we asked the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry to approve from the start of our contracts was for us to be able to continue to worship here after all the work is finished and the next called and installed permanent pastor is in place. (Ordinarily, the interim pastor moves on to another assignment, or the previous pastor retires and disconnects from the life of the congregation.)

We are confident that we (the 2 of us and all of you!) can navigate these changes when the time comes. Until then, there is work to be done, worship to be celebrated, history to be assessed, discernment to be prayerfully discovered, and a life together in Christ to be enjoyed.

We are looking forward to it and we hope you are too!

My Eagle Scout Project was to upgrade the Food Pantry for the First Presbyterian Church in Branchville. My project consisted of relocating and rebuilding the Food Pantry. I created a new setup and layout for better functionality and accessibility for the staff and public. I assembled a new shelf system and restocked, organized, and labeled food items for better organization and location. I also made a new entrance sign for the pantry. Personally, my Favorite Part of Scouting has been the opportunity to build deep friendships with incredible people.

Charlie Burke IV. My name is Charles Burke. I have been in Scouting since 2010 and became an Eagle Scout at 17. For my Eagle Scout project I created a Gaga-Ball pit and fixed the existing gaga-ball pit for the YMCA. It was two months of development and four days of physical work. After my project I worked at the YMCA for the summer, hearing fantastic things about my project and how it's appreciated. Description of Eagle Project - My Eagle Scout Project was building 2 kayak racks and 2 paddleboard racks, which were donated to Camp Linwood MacDonald's aquatic area. My favorite part of scouting was the life skills I learned that will better prepare me for my future. I find leadership to be the most important of these skills that I have learned.

Gabriel is very excited to enter the third generation of eagle scouts in his family along with his older brother.

Aidan Serrano. I am Aidan Serrano, and I have been a boy scout for 6 years, and also spent many years in cub scouts before that. I did my Eagle Scout project for SCARC, a nonprofit committed to working with people with developmental disabilities. The focus of my project was demolishing and rebuilding a taller and stronger standing garden in the backyard of one of the group homes. By doubling the height of the garden, I hope that the residents of the home will not have to bend down so much when gardening, and can enjoy the activity with a clean area. As for my favorite part of scouting, it is the camping with the other people in my troop, which has always been something I looked forward to in the past.

OCTOBER SESSION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

- This month's Session meeting was all about the proposed budget for 2024. Many changes were made moving line items around to better fit their description. We were unable to come up with a total for expenses and income at this meeting, but after doing some research and hard work, we will have these totals ready for the Congregational meeting on October 29, 2023.
- We are behind on pledges by \$30,234.
- We are behind on member giving by \$20,552.
- Loose giving is behind by \$762.
- Other (not pledged) is behind by \$22,733.
- In 2023 we budgeted \$2500 for Per Capita and to date have only received \$1827. This puts us behind by \$673.
- E giving is ahead by \$11,512.
- Due to the \$60,000 re-payment and donation from the Hatches, we ended September with \$90,055.79.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Easy Pumpkin Pie

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup canned pumpkin
- 1/2 cup Original Bisquick mix
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 cup evaporated milk
- 1 tablespoon butter softened
- 1 1/2 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 2 eggs
- Whipped topping (optional)



PREPARATION

Step 1. Heat oven to 350°F. Grease 9-inch pie plate.

Step 2. Stir all ingredients except whipped topping until blended.

Step 3. Bake 35 to 40 minutes or until knife inserted in center comes out clean. Cool 30 minutes. Refrigerate about 3 hours or until chilled. Serve with whipped topping. Store covered in refrigerator.

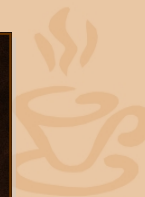

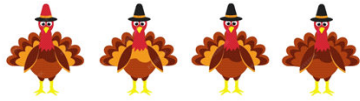

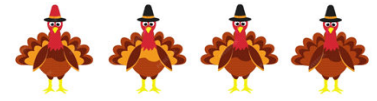
