Fresh Strawberry Jam

INGREDIENTS

- 2 qt. fresh strawberries (about 2lbs.) hulled and chopped
- 3 cups granulated sugar
- 5 tablespoons fresh lemon juice (from 2 large lemons)



PREPARATION

- 1. Stir together strawberries and sugar in a large saucepan. Cook over medium, stirring occasionally, until sugar dissolves. Stir in lemon juice. Increase heat to medium-high; let mixture come to a boil, stirring often. Continue boiling over medium-high, stirring often, 1 minute.
- 2. Reduce heat to medium. Attach a candy thermometer to saucepan; simmer mixture over medium, stirring often, until mixture reaches 220°F, about 30 minutes
- 3. Immediately ladle jam into 2 (2-cup) sterilized canning jars. Cover jars with lids, and let cool completely at room temperature, about 2 hours. Store in refrigerator up to 2 months.
