This month I've been preaching on I Corinthians, where Paul tries to bolster a church he had founded a few years earlier, to help them get past the divisions that have developed amongst them. Going in four different directions within the one church there in Corinth, Paul tries to pull them back together into a single body again all following Jesus Christ. You can feel the love he has for them as he points out their strengths and blessings, and tries to bring them back together in a unity of purpose.

Most likely the divisions have caused hard feelings between the groups. Accusations, bitterness, one-ups-manship, thoughtlessness, and pride have all arisen in their dispute, none of which is easy to get over. Like them, we've all had someone cut us down. We've all had someone take advantage of us. We've all been the object of jealousy or false rumors, and *none* of it feels good. The easy way is to continue the progression, returning hurt for hurt, and pain for pain. It's not easy to take the high road. There's a poem about that called.

To apologize,
To begin over,
To be unselfish,
To take advice,
To admit error,
To face a sneer,
To be charitable,
To keep trying,
To be considerate,
To avoid mistakes,
To endure success,

To keep out of a rut,
To make the best of little,
To subdue an unruly temper,
To shoulder a deserved blame,
To recognize the silver lining—

BUT IT ALWAYS PAYS.

I think that's what Paul was getting at. To follow the example of the One who went to the cross, even when he was innocent. That's what we're called to do as well—not take the easy way of revenge or pettiness, but the harder way that breaks the cycle. I don't offer this page of thoughts like I have it all figured out myself. So let's all

make a stronger effort to live up to Christ's example, and I'll see you in church where we can support each other in the attempts.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

TURKEY BISCUIT STEW

INGREDIENTS:

- 1/3 cup chopped onion
- 1/4 cup butter, cubed
- 1/3 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon pepper
- 1 can condensed chicken broth
- 3/4 cup 2% milk
- 2 cups cubed cooked turkey
- 1 cup cooked peas
- 1 cup cooked baby carrots
- 1 tube large refrigerated buttermilk biscuits



DIRECTIONS:

Preheat oven to 375°. In a 10-in. cast-iron or other ovenproof skillet, sauté onion in butter until tender. Stir in the flour, salt and pepper until blended. Gradually add broth and milk. Bring to a boil. Cook and stir until thickened and bubbly, about 2 minutes. Add the turkey, peas and carrots; heat through. Separate biscuits and arrange over the stew.

Bake until biscuits are golden brown, 20-25 minutes.
