NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Transition Time

I love reading about the travels of Paul. He made three trips around the eastern Mediterranean, meeting people, sharing the gospel, helping communities of believers get a start. I imagine the small groups of new Christians meeting with Paul; they would have guestions, he would teach, and the Spirit would be working through it all.

It is clear that Paul never intended to stay in any of these places he visited such as Ephesus, Thessolonika, Corinth, or any of the little villages along the way to these larger places. Paul had a very specific ministry – he was called to share the gospel with as many people as possible, including the Gentiles. This was a radical call, because the church council in Jerusalem believed the gospel was for Jews, not for anyone else. (The account of how this controversy was dealt with is found in Acts 15-16).

Transition times for congregations have some similarities to these early communities. A transitional pastor comes with particular training and gifts and with very specific tasks to accomplish while preparing a congregation for its next called pastor. 1st Presbyterian of Branchville has been waiting for this transition process to start since the retirement of Pastor Jeff Hatch. We see signs of faith and hope in this congregation: there is solid and active lay leadership and openness to the changes that come with new pastoral leadership.

As we enter into Advent, the season of waiting and preparing, we can look forward to the birth of Christ and then to our own season of waiting and preparing. May the wonder and joy of the Christmas season remain with us as we travel this transition time together!

ing, and intensive case management services. RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Easy Truffle Recipe

INGREDIENTS

- 3 cups semisweet chocolate chips
- 1 can sweetened condensed milk
- 1 tablespoon vanilla
- Toasted finely chopped nuts
- Assorted sprinkles



PREPARATION

- 1. Place chocolate chips and milk in a microwave-safe bowl; microwave on high for 3 minutes, stirring halfway through. Stir in vanilla. Refrigerate, covered, until firm enough to shape, about 3 hours.
- 2. Shape into 1-in. balls; roll in nuts or jimmies. Place in a 15x10x1-in. pan; refrigerate until firm, about 1 hour.
