NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

For those of you who don't know, I am a P.K. (Preacher's Kid). I grew up going to morning and evening services, wearing my "Sunday best", smiling for pictures even when I was "less than pleased", coloring in the pew (but usually not on the pew!), and enduring a hot sanctuary in the summer and a cold one in the winter.

Having the "privilege" of 2 clergy parents means that our three children are PK's times 2! Growing up they would often complain to us that they didn't have a choice. They had to come to church. We reassured them that they ALWAYS had a choice: They could come to church "happy" ... or "not so happy!"

These days, with all the competing claims upon our time and with many activities being scheduled on Sunday it seems as though a sense of Sabbath is slipping away. For parents, especially those with small children, Sunday presents all kinds of challenges. We appreciate the efforts parents are making and the time and effort involved. This is equally true whether your children attend Sunday School or whether they are in the pew with you.

Recently I came across a blog article by Jamie Bruesehoff. It is addressed to parents, but it speaks to us all and reminds us of how important it is to welcome one another with the hospitality of Jesus. Here's what she has written:

Dear Parents With Young Children in Church

You are doing something really, really important. I know it's not easy. I see you with your arms overflowing, and I know you came to church already tired. Parenting is tiring. Really tiring.

I watch you bounce and sway trying to keep the baby quiet, juggling the infant car seat and the diaper bag as you find a seat. I see you wince as your child cries. I see you anxiously pull things out of your bag of tricks to try to quiet them. (CONTINUE PG. 3) And I see you with your toddler and your preschooler. I watch you cringe when your little girl asks an innocent question in a voice that might not be an inside voice let alone a church whisper. I hear the exasperation in your voice as you beg your child to just sit, to be quiet as you feel everyone's eyes on you. Not everyone is looking, but I know it feels that way.

I know you're wondering, is this worth it? Why do I bother? I know you often leave church more exhausted than fulfilled. But what you are doing is so important. When you are here, the church is filled with a joyful noise. When you are here, the Body of Christ is more fully present. When you are here, we are reminded that this worship thing we do isn't about Bible Study or personal, quiet contemplation but coming together to worship as a community where all are welcome, where we share in the Word and Sacrament together.

When you are here, I have hope that these pews won't be empty in 10 years when your kids are old enough to sit quietly and behave in worship. I know that they are learning how and why we worship now, before it's too late. They are learning that worship is important.

I see them learning. In the midst of the cries, whines, and giggles, in the midst of the crinkling of pretzel bags and the growing pile of crumbs, I see a little girl who insists on going two pews up to share peace with someone she's never met. I hear a little boy slurping (quite loudly) every last drop of his communion wine out of the cup, determined not to miss a drop of Jesus. I watch a child excitedly color a cross and point to the one in the front of the sanctuary. I hear the echos of "Amens" just a few seconds after the rest of the community says it together. I watch a boy just learning to read try to sound out the words in the worship book or count his way to Hymn 672. Even on weeks when I can't see my own children learning because, well, it's one of "those mornings," I can see your children learning.

I know how hard it is to do what you're doing, but I want you to know it matters. It matters to me. It matters to my children to not be alone in the pew. It matters to the congregation to know that families care about faith, to see young people... and even on those weeks when you can't see the little moments, it matters to your children.


It matters that they learn that worship is what we do as a community of faith, that everyone is welcome, that their worship matters. When we teach children that their worship matters, we teach them that they are enough right here and right now as members of the church community. They don't need to wait until they can believe, pray or worship a certain way to be welcome here, and I know adults who are still looking to be shown that. It matters that children learn that they are an integral part of this church, that their prayers, their songs, and even their badly (or perfectly-timed, depending on who you ask) cries and whines are a joyful noise because it means they are present.

I know it's hard, but thank you for what you do when you bring your children to church. Please know that your family -- with all of its noise, struggle, commotion, and joy -- are not simply tolerated, you are a vital part of the community gathered in worship.

We hope to see you soon!

In February we are encouraged to think more about the love in our lives. It's also a great time to remember that, as Christians, we have the privilege and power to share the great Love of Christ far beyond our own limited reach. The 2024 Per Capita is \$42.50 per person. Our Per Capita is used to pay administrative costs of Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly, and also

goes toward denominational missions. It would help us meet our budget if you would use the Per Capita envelope, or note on a check "Per Capita," to help us offset what we have to pay out of our church budget. So please, in February, as you celebrate the many gifts of Love, remember to Love Your Church with your Per Capita gift.

JANUARY SESSION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS (1/08)

- The Session approved by consensus that the Deacons will get an email/telephone chain together for letting the congregation know of any announcements.
- The Fellowship Committee will put a new member process together.
- Officer training (Elders & Deacons) will take place on January 20, 2024 from 10 am until noon in Fellowship Hall.
- There will be a Session retreat. Date and time to be determined.
- Two Elders and three congregational members will be needed to form a team for discernment study.
- We will need some members to volunteer to be Sunday School teachers.
- Our year ended with the following figures:
- Pledges are \$56,699
- Member Giving is \$41,403
- Per Capita is \$4,044
- E giving is \$24,979
- The Missions Committee collected \$145 to be added to the budgeted amount of \$250 for a total donation amount of \$395 for our fourth quarter mission, Family Promise of Sussex County.
- There will be another soup & study classes beginning January 11th.
- Pastor Chris Doyle will be here on February 15th to give a program on the current situation on Palestine.
- We still have two positions open for Deacons and two positions open for Elders. Please volunteer. Your talents are needed.
- A motion was made and approved for the additional costs for hooking up the new stove up to \$2,000.
- So far, \$73,400 has been pledged for 2024 vs. the budgeted \$80,000.
- 31 pledge cards were returned vs. 110 sent out.
- Our website needs to be updated and we will need an I. T. person.
- Another Adult Study was approved by the Session on "Who Jesus Is". Dates to be announced.
- members. This is 35% less pledges received to date compared to last year.
- This is \$56,420 in pledges vs. the \$80,000 budget.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Strawberry Valentines Chex Mix

INGREDIENTS

- 4-6 cups Rice Chex cereal
- 1 8- oz bag Strawberry Candy Melts OR
- 1 bag of white chocolate baking chips
- 1 box of Strawberry Creme Jell-O Pudding
- Valentines M&M's and/or Sprinkles



PREPARATION

- 1. Measure out Chex cereal into a large bowl. Note: if you're using the Strawberry Candy Melts, you'll use 4 cups of cereal. If you're using the white chocolate chips + pudding mix, you'll use 6 cups of cereal.
- Pour chocolate into a small glass dish. Add 1/2 tsp shortening, if desired, to help the chocolate coat the cereal easier. Microwave for 1 minute 20 seconds. Let sit in the microwave for 3 minutes. Remove and gently stir. If chocolate loves its shape and looks smooth, it's done. If not, return to the microwave in 15 second increments, letting it sit for 2-3 minutes each time, until melted and smooth.
- If you used White Chocolate Chips + Pudding Mix: Add 4 TBSP of the strawberry creme pudding into the white chocolate and stir gently until smooth. Add 2 drops of red food coloring, if desired.
- 4. Pour the chocolate mixture over the Chex cereal and stir gently to coat.
- 5. Transfer cereal mixture to a large piece of wax paper. Sprinkle with M&M's and Valentines sprinkles, if desired. Let cool to set. Break pieces and store in an airtight container to save. Candy can be made up to 3-4 days ahead, if desired. It saves well!
