

Backwards and Forward

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

As I look backward, what a memorable past month January was. It began quite sadly with doing the funeral of Joanne Lawson. She has been one of the pillars of our assembly, chairing Officer and Personnel, helping us find officers with the Nominating Committee, keeping track of our finances and reporting to the Session every month, singing in the choir, and faithfully attending and participating in the life of the church. She will be greatly missed not only for all she did, but for the person she was: funny, serious, supportive, and a dedicated Christian.

But on the last Sunday of this month I baptized six(!) children into our fellowship. I think some of it has to do with my/our retirement in just a few weeks, but it was so wonderful to walk those children up and down the aisles introducing them to their family of faith. It truly did my heart good to see the next generation of children refilling our ranks as led by their loving parents.

It has felt odd to not be leading a Youth Group these past two years, but I see our Sunday School filling back up and experiencing wonderful lessons each week that keeps them coming back for more, and I foresee a new Confirmation Class and then a Youth Group just a few more years down the line.

And as I look forward I'm heartened to see five new members who just joined our church who will be presented the first Sunday of February, and new officers who will be ordained and installed (or re-installed) the second Sunday. Both of our boards have a full complement of 9, which hasn't happened the past few years. Folks are stepping up to help lead, and that is the mark of a strong church. Pastor Nancy Young will be filling in after I retire, and Robin Van Dyk and other subs will be filling in on the organ after Kay retires, so we know the church will be in great hands for worship. Pastor Nancy will also be moderating our Session and is available for pastoral duties as well (visitations, funerals, weddings, baptisms, etc.) until an Interim is hired this coming Spring. The Session is hard at work writing the job description for the Interim, and it's hoped that a pastor will be found for that position by June 1st.

Kay and I are trying to see beyond February 14th, and the view is murky, but a few things loom on the horizon for us. The first is that we're going to move into a 55+ community in Manalapan, NJ (just west of Freehold in central NJ). It will be much closer to where our boys will live. That is important because we'll be grandparents in August, and can't wait to welcome our first! So this year sees both of us retiring, buying a house, selling a house, and moving close to where our sons' families and our first grandchild will be.

Lots of changes lie ahead for both us and the church in the months ahead, but it can be an exciting time, facing something new and challenging. Let's all head into this unknown future with our known God, who is watching over us and going with us through it all. Looking backwards reminds us that God has always been there for us, which gives us courage and hope as we face forward into the future. May God bless us all as we take these next steps of faith.

- The Session has approved the revised budget for 2023.

REGIPE OF THE MONTH

Banana Cake

INGREDIENTS

- 1 (15-1/4-ounce) package white cake mix
- 1 (4 serving size) package instant banana cream pudding and pie filling
- 1 1/2 cups milk
- 1/3 cup vegetable oil
- 3 eggs
- 2 very ripe bananas, mashed
- 1 cup mini chocolate chips
- 1 cup hazelnut spread with cocoa
- 1/4 cup sliced almonds (optional)



PREPARATION

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Coat a 9- x 13-inch baking dish with cooking spray.
- 2. In a large bowl with an electric mixer, beat cake mix, pudding mix, milk, oil, and eggs until thoroughly combined. Add bananas and chocolate chips; mix well. Pour batter into baking dish.
- 3. Bake 40 to 45 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean; let cool. Spread chocolate hazelnut spread evenly over top of cake and sprinkle with almonds if desired. Cut into squares and serve.
