

MAY SESSION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS of MAY 8, 2023

- Sunday School end of year program will possibly be held on June 11, 2023.
- Looked into getting a defibrillator for the church. There are many rules to be followed. A few people must be certified to work with it. The unit must be inspected annually. An attorney has advised us not to get one because this opens us up to liability.

By consensus, it was agreed that we not have one in-house.

- One Great Hour of Sharing total collections were \$870.00.
- Vacation Bible School will possibly be a one day event again this year. Details to follow.
- Deacons should be in charge of keeping a supply of coffee in-house.
- The Health Inspector has approved our kitchen with a satisfactory rating.
- Our fire certificate is out-of-date. Trying to contact the Fire Marshall or the Fire Inspector for Branchville Boro.
- Our stove is no longer useable. It has to go. We cannot get any more gas delivered for our stove. The hook-up is not to code.
- Got an estimate from Willco for air conditioning. \$39,000 for the sanctuary only. Will get an estimate for Fellowship Hall.
- Patrick Murphy has re-wired the cross in the Narthex as the wires were burned out. Thank you Patrick! Mike will put a timer on the cross.

This is what the 13 folds mean:

1. The first fold of our flag is a symbol of life.



2. The second fold signifies our belief in eternal life.

3. The third fold is made in honor and tribute of the veteran departing our ranks, and who gave a portion of his or her life for the defense of our country to attain peace.

4. The fourth fold exemplifies our weaker nature as citizens trusting in God; it is to Him we turn for His divine guidance.

5. The fifth fold is an acknowledgement to our country, for in the words of Stephen Decatur, "Our country, in dealign with other countries, may she always be right, but it is still our country, right or wrong."

6. The sixth fold is for where our hearts lie. It is with our heart that we pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

7. The seventh fold is a tribute to our armed forces, for it is through the armed forces that we protect our country and our flag against all enemies.

8. The eighth fold is a tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day, and to honor our mother, for whom it flies on Mother's Day.

9. The ninth fold is an honor to womanhood, for it has been through their faith, love, loyalty, and devotion that the character of men and women who have made this country great have been molded.

10. The 10th fold is a tribute to father, for he, too, has given his sons and daughters for the defense of our country since he or she was first-born.

11. The 11th fold, in the eyes of Hebrew citizens, represents the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon and glorifies, in their eyes, the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

12. The 12th fold, in the eyes of a Christian citizen, represents an emblem of eternity and glorifies, in their eyes, God the Father, the Son, and Holy Ghost.

13. The last fold, when the flag is completely folded, the stars are uppermost, reminding us of our national motto, "In God We Trust."

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Fresh Strawberry Mousse

INGREDIENTS

- 12 1/2 ounces strawberries (3/4 pound)
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1 cup whole or whipping cream (cold)
- extra strawberries for topping



PREPARATION

- 1. Clean and slice the strawberries, In a blender or food processor add the sliced strawberries and the sugar and puree. Remove 1/2 a cup of puree and set aside.
- 2. In a cold bowl add the cream and beat until stiff peaks form. Then fold in the remaining puree (not the 1/2 cup) gently.
- 3. Divide the 1/2 cup of puree between the 4 small/medium** glasses and top with the strawberry mousse. Refrigerate for approximately 1 hour or even over night if desired. Top with fresh sliced strawberries and serve. Enjoy.
