Welcome Pastor Pete Hofstra

I am Rev. Peter Hofstra, Pastor Pete, and it will be my privilege to walk with you in this time of transition here in Branchville. I presently hail from Edison, New Jersey, where I live with my beautiful wife Lynn, my son Matthew, and our three dogs. Before coming here, I served the First Presbyterian Church of Perth Amboy for over twenty years as their called pastor. Prior to that, I served for a short time at the First Presbyterian Church of Bernardsville and actually began ministry as a chaplain at a nursing home/rehab center in Mountainside.

Accent-wise, occasionally the Canadian of my birth may slip through. My family hails from Canada and lives there presently, most of them in the

greater Toronto area (or 'Trono' if the Canadian slips out). I received my Master of Divinity in the last century from Princeton Theological Seminary. I am not actually Presbyterian by birth but was raised in the Christian Reformed Church, a church of Dutch Reformed heritage over and against the Scottish Reformed heritage of the Presbyterian Church. Before the M.Div., I received in M.A. in Religion from Westminster Theological Seminary in Philadelphia, with a focus in Biblical Studies. I am, rather proudly, a bible nerd.

In the coming year, the journey we will take together is one of renewal, rediscovery, and reimagining of the faith life of the Branchville Presbyterian Church. This is the time for the community to come together to explore who you are in the Lord. This is inclusive of processing the emotions of a long-time pastor leaving, the questions of 'what comes next', and the exciting possibilities of what lie before us.

In the meantime, our journey of faith goes forward. We will worship, we will serve, we will eat (maybe my biggest pastoral hazard outside of talking too much), and we will enjoy the love of the Lord

together. I am looking forward to meeting each and every one of you in the weeks to come. I ask for your prayers for myself and this church as we seek to step intentionally into the Lord's Plan.


Our mission is to gather as a church family for worship and spiritual fellowship, to nurture and educate, and to proclaim the gospel to the world.





AUGUST SESSION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

- Session approved the purchase of a new stove at \$1700.
- All bills for June are paid up.
- Rally Day will be held on September 10, 2023.
- Jeff and Kay Hatch have repaid the \$50,000 loan from the church to purchase their house and included an extra \$10,000 to the church. Many thanks go out to the Hatches for their many years of excellent service and for the donation.
- Communion in September will be by intinction.
- Elder Mark Hontz will be back to preach on September 10, 2023.
- Worship will be on the Opilla Farm on August 28, 2023 followed by a pot luck luncheon.
- There is a new policy for new hires. Once this is approved by Session, it will be a digital document, available for all to see.
- Pastor Pete will begin as interim Pastor on September 17, 2023.
- A dead tree in the back yard will be removed by Midhurst soon.
- Poison ivy will be sprayed.
- Pastor's office has been painted, New ceiling tile and lights will be done soon. This was funded by the Daisey Roe Group.
- Daisey Roe wants to paint Alycia's office at a future date.
- The front door of the church needs to be replaced. Shopping around for a good price.
- The old stove in Fellowship Hall will be removed and a new stove will be installed.
- The sign out front of the Sanctuary needs to be updated. The words "Christian Counseling" needs to be removed as we no longer have a counselor.
- Will be selling some office furniture and an extra refrigerator. Also need to dispose of an upright freezer.
- There was some discussion on whether or not to remove the rainbow symbol on the sign out front. It was decided by Session to keep the rainbow symbol as a confirmation that "All are welcome".
- Beginning September 1, 2023, the Food Pantry will be open Wednesdays only.

Step up and out for Stewardship

Exodus 16:11-16, 31 (God provides manna to the Israelites in the wilderness)

The provision of manna to the Israelites wandering in the wilderness is a reminder that God provides abundantly for all of us. The details in this story of "meat at night and bread in the morning" and the delicious description of the manna offer a unique perspective that God doesn't just give us the bare minimum, but provides abundantly. In turn, we are called to share abundantly in our response to God, not just offering the bare minimum, but offering our best.

Rev. Greg Allen-Pickett is Pastor and Head of Staff of First Presbyterian Church in Hastings, Nebraska. He is a native of Flagstaff, Arizona, where he was an active member of Federated Community Church. Greg is a graduate of Pacific Lutheran University in Tacoma, Washington, and he also holds a Master of Divinity degree from Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary. Greg has worked in small, medium, and large churches and also worked at the PC (USA) denominational offices in Louisville as the general manager of Presbyterian World Mission.

What is Stewardship: Service

Service is one of the 4 pillars of stewardship. It is love in action. Why discuss service now?

- * Maybe because it starts with an S as in September.
- * Maybe because in September, in the world as we know it, school starts, activities and calendars change, and in our case, a new interim minister will join us.

Love is a core of stewardship. If love is in action, how can you serve? Think not just of how to serve in our church. How do you serve your community? How do you love or serve spiritually? Do you serve with time, talent or treasures?

Time: Sharing our time is a truly wondrous part of stewardship. As we take time from our daily busy schedules to do good works for God, we receive a lesson in caring, loving, and kindness. It is through those lessons that we get a fuller understanding; it truly is better to give than it is to receive.

Talents: God entrust each of us with multiple talents and abilities to be used for God's purposes. Talents may be natural or developed interest. As we come to understand stewardship, we are challenged to look inward, to acknowledge our own skills and talents, and apply those things to our daily life for the glory of God.

The above scripture from Exodus reminds us that our God is to be celebrated. We celebrate all year the abundance He and our church gives us.

We show our gratitude in the action of serving. As we receive the Word of God through worship, scriptures, and witness, stewardship becomes an issue of faith development expressed through generosity and commitment toward continuing Christ's work in the world.

Roasted Fall Vegetables

INGREDIENTS

- 1 pound peeled carrots & parsnips
- 1 1/2 baby potatoes
- 1 package of cut butternut squash
- 5 shallots, cut lengthwise
- 1 head of garlic, cloves separated
- 3 Tablespoons olive oil
- 1 1/2 teaspoons pepper
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 2 Tablespoons chopped rosemary or thyme



PREPARATION

- 1. Preheat the oven to 425°. Line a large baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 2. Place all the vegetables in a large mixing bowl, add the oil, salt, pepper, rosemary and give them a good toss. Arrange the mixture in a single layer on the baking sheet. If they don't all fit use two baking sheets.
- 3. Bake at 425° for 30-40 minutes or until all vegetables are tender and lightly browned.
- 4. Transfer roasted vegetables to a large serving platter and serve warm.
