APRIL SESSION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS (3/04)

- Opening balance this month is \$99,060.
- Per Capita third payment of \$626.88 was made on March 20th.
- OGHS raised \$745.
- \$2000 grant came in from Presbytery to cover the cost of new mics totaling \$1198.
- 1st quarter taxes paid Federal \$1741 and State \$188.
- Electrical work completed \$768.
- Coffee has been re-stocked at \$166. \$90 came in from the coffee jar donations.
- Website renewed this year at \$192.
- Our roll count is now 180.
- Cold Nose Warm Heart will hold a pet adoption day in the Fall of 2024.
- Motion was approved to upgrade the sound system in the sanctuary at a cost of \$3402.
- The swing set in the back yard will be taken down and re-furbished.
- Per Capita is coming in slowly. Have received \$963 so far.
- Stove installation has been finalized.
- Music & Worship Committee will purchase two new white banners for the Sanctuary.
- Name tags have been purchased and provided for members and visitors in the narthex to be worn during worship and coffee hour. Baskets are for returning name tags.
- Women's book study will begin on April 17th with the Red Tent being the first book to be discussed.
- The Discernment team will beginning their meetings this week.
- New adult study group began on April 11th. Topic: "How the Bible Came to Be."
- The Pastors' have provided pinwheels on the front lawn to support Ginnies House to promote child abuse awareness.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Spring Lemon Tart

INGREDIENTS

- 3 large eggs
- 1-1/4 cups sugar
- 1/4 cup lemon juice
- 1 tablespoon grated orange zest
- 1/4 cup butter, melted

CRUST

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/3 cup confectioners' sugar
- 1/2 cup ground almonds
- 1 teaspoon grated lemon zest
- 1 teaspoon grated orange zest
- 1/2 cup cold butter, cubed



PREPARATION

- 1. Let eggs stand at room temperature for 30 minutes.
- 2. Preheat oven to 350°. Whisk together eggs, sugar, lemon juice and orange zest. Whisk in butter until smooth. Set aside.
- 3. For crust, pulse first 6 ingredients in a food processor until mixture forms a ball. Press dough onto bottom and up the sides of an ungreased 9-in. tart pan.
- 4. Pour lemon mixture into crust. Bake until center is almost set, 25-30 minutes. Cool on a wire rack. Just before serving, sprinkle with confectioners' sugar and, if desired, fresh raspberries.
